

GSB/MCHB Technical Assistance Meeting for Newborn Screening & Genetics Infrastructure Grants

Format for State Presentations

Each State grantee has been asked to give a **seven minute** talk on their activities, current and proposed, as they relate to their integrated service system grant. The presentations for all 11 States are scheduled on October 10th from 9:15 a.m. to Noon in alphabetical order, as listed on the agenda. Your talk should be based on a presentation of two flow charts which should describe the service flow and data flow in your State. It is the Genetic Services Program's intent to incorporate these flow charts into the final proceedings of this meeting. These proceedings will be posted on the National Newborn Screening and Genetics Resource Center's web-site. **An LCD and overhead projector will be available for your use during your presentation.**

- Service flow: showing what happens along the continuum of service delivery (screening, counseling, testing, follow-up and sub-specialty services) for families with newborns or children with or at risk for heritable disorders. Include access to medical homes, family-to-family support and other enabling and direct health care services, as relevant. The flow chart should show who refers patients to whom, and who does the necessary follow-up, all the way out the branching tree of the comprehensive and seamless continuum of services.
- Data flow: showing who collects and transfers what data to whom, to *monitor and support* the service delivery system.
